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FROM THE LOADING BENCH

Hello, this is Jay Miazga, your president for 2015.

I am planning to regularly add this section to the Target, with the intent of letting members know about things going on with their club that they might not hear about otherwise. "President's Message" or "Notes from the President" seemed way too formal - The Loading Bench is metaphor for all the work that gets done behind the scenes to keep the club firing.

First, I wish to issue an apology on behalf of myself and my fellow Board members. The dues increase came as an unpleasant surprise to most of you, and that was because we simply screwed up. The Board had been working hard at the end of last year to communicate the need for the increase to the Proprietary members, who are the people who make the actual decision via ballot. Once this was done and the votes counted (of 147 Proprietary members, 93 returned ballots - 62 voted for the increase, 31 voted against), we dropped the ball on getting this information and decision to the rest of the membership. Hopefully the information that was sent out after the fact via the Target was enough to satisfy the "why", but that understanding doesn't make up for the ham-fisted "how". Better communication is a goal for this year's Board.

That said, one of the first things I want to communicate is the structure of the decision making for the club (per the Bylaws). At the highest level are the Proprietary members, who are the actual owners of the club. They are asked to vote on large, impactful decisions like the dues increase, property purchases or other large expenditures, who is elected to the Board, etc.

The Board then makes the next level decisions - for example, the decision to spend \$40k to remodel the trophy room, to what extent and who will remodel the bar, etc. Also many smaller things, like who is mentioned in the Target's Spotlight for their volunteer efforts. Three of the nine Board positions are up for election each year in January. Once the new Board is formed at the January General Meeting, the Board then elects officers - President, VP, Secretary, and Treasurer.

The next decision making level is that of the Committees, which are formed from Board and other members as appropriate. The House Committee is responsible for many of the day-to-day decisions necessary to run the club, and generally for establishing rules and regulations for the club in general (although not specifically for the ranges - which is the purview of the Range Committee), and specifically for the Clubhouse (including the Pine Tree Room).

Not mentioned in the Bylaws is the role of club Manager. The Bylaws were written when the club was much, much smaller. As the club has grown, the Board has understood and supported the need for a Manager. The Manager reports to the House Committee, and is given responsibility for many of the day-to-day decisions that are made to keep the club running.

Frankly, this reporting structure and decision making has gotten confused at times, and has resulted in some muddled communication. Not many read the Bylaws, so my hope in describing this structure is that members will know how decisions get made, and who to go to with issues or suggestions. If you're still not sure, start with the Manager (Ursula), and work up. You are also free to contact me (president@hhrodandgun.com), although be aware that the President has very little decision making authority (I don't even get a vote at the Board meetings). All I can do is field questions and comments, and talk to people. I have no idea if this is going to result in me getting 2 emails a week or 200, but I'll try to be as responsive as I can.

Thanks for reading through this. I think 2015 will be a great year for the club. Cheers, -jay
