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FROM THE LOADING BENCH

Hello again.

First, I'd like to thank everyone who attended the President's Ball Saturday night - great food, great music, great company. Fun night. Ron's speech was way better than mine, but I'll get over it - he's a tough act to follow. I'm not sure we've done a good job of communicating this, but the P Ball is not an "invite only" thing - attendance is open to all members. Come join us next year!

The topic for this month is inspired by an email from a member that made a thought provoking point about the perceived value of the current dues level vs. how you use the club. The member's specific point was that if you are a "social" member (i.e., don't use the range facilities), that the dues could be seen as somewhat unfair because they are paying the same amount as members who also utilize the ranges. They also felt that at the current dues level, some "social" members may decide not to continue their membership because they are only using clubhouse facilities and yet are still having to pay the full dues to support the ranges. (To the member who sent this - I would liked to have responded personally in addition to this broadcast message, but I seem to have lost your original message . My apologies).

This concern naturally brings to mind the idea of having different membership types - for instance "social only", "range only" or "full". Apparently this idea has been discussed by the Board in the past, as I found out when I brought this email up for discussion at the January meeting. My fellow Board members made these points:

- The club's membership administration is currently done by a volunteer, and takes up a great deal of time. If we added more complexity, we would probably have to pay someone to administer the dues. BTW, this is also the reason we have rejected the idea of monthly or biannual dues billing.
- A significant reason not to differentiate comes from looking at how the dues are spent. The major portion of the ongoing costs are associated with the clubhouse and the Pine Tree Room. When the club is open, whether there is no one there or 100, the heat and lights are on, there is paid staff ready to cook, serve, and tend bar, and we still have to pay for insurance, accounting, maintenance, etc., etc. Range activities, on the other hand, are largely self funding. Shotgunners pay for each line shot, and there is a fee for entering pistol, shotgun, speed steel, and metallic silhouette matches. It could be argued that this is unfair to those that only use the ranges! But of course, it's not that simple. Major improvements on the ranges (land purchases, trap shack, new speed bays) are funded by dues. As, of course, are major improvements to the clubhouse (Trophy room, pending bar remodels, kitchen equipment). And most shooters also use the clubhouse.
- But for me, the most compelling reason not to create different membership types is: How would we regulate or monitor such a setup? If a "social only" member was using ranges, how would we know? If a "range only" member walked in the clubhouse, would we ask them to leave? It would not only be very difficult to manage, but would potentially create frictions that would work at odds to ideals we have for the club that all members at all times feel welcome and are treated well.

So after this discussion, I've come to believe it is a misconception that a member who utilizes only a portion of the facilities is unfairly supporting others that use a different portion. And that differentiating use would certainly be complicated, and possibly detrimental to the club's environment.

Bottom line? I think we're all in this together.
