FROM THE LOADING BENCH

Hello all,

Since the shooting season has gotten into full swing, I thought that this month I would blatantly shill our various shooting facilities and events. It's always nice to see new faces at the ranges, and especially so at the organized shooting events.

If you haven't attended one of our events, I'd like to encourage you to do so this year. As incentive, I'll note that we've passed the two-year mark on our required Range Orientation, and you may be needing to "re-up" before you can continue to use the ranges. You will have the opportunity to do so if you participate in one of our organized shooting events that utilize either the pistol or rifle ranges, or the action bays. We review gun and range safety before each event, and you will get to demonstrate your understanding of safe practices.

Except for our open shotgun shooting (Thursdays and Sundays) and our novice shotgun shoots, our organized events are staged as competitions. Please don't be put off by this. The competition is friendly, and I think it's fair to say that most of the participants attend because it's fun, not because they are emotionally invested in the outcome. I also think you would be hard pressed to find shooting matches any place else where new shooters are more welcomed and encouraged. If you still feel like you want to ease into it, come watch a match or two - we have a tremendous variety of shooting going on at the club, and my hope is you'll find something that appeals to you and gets you coming out on a regular basis.

Let me add a few comments for those who might own firearms solely for self-defense, and might not see the relevance of participating in a match. Perhaps you come to the range at intervals to practice (an excellent idea). If, however, you find yourself in the rare and unfortunate position of having to use lethal force to defend yourself or other innocents, the stress of that situation will be vastly different from calmly punching holes in paper targets. I'm not saying that the stress of a match creates physiological changes that come anywhere close to a self defense situation. But the experience of, say, fumbling a magazine change during a match that you have easily done during practice is educational. Same with short stroking your pump shotgun on a skeet double. If you can still run your gun and hit targets with an accelerated heart rate, the shakes, and some degradation of the senses, cognitive abilities, and motor skills, then you have a better chance in the real world. And with match experience, these effects generally moderate - also valuable. It will make you a better shooter, and a safer one.

Here are some brief descriptions of shooting available:

- Shotgun: Ranges open for Trap (including Continental and Handicap), and Skeet on Thursdays. 5-stand also available on Sunday. Shotgun matches are generally run on the first Saturday of the month. You get to use a shotgun to break things flying through the air. How fun is that?
- Pistol: The courses of fire are tremendously varied, but usually include at least some untimed accuracy and some timed events. There are often restrictions on the caliber and sights for a given event or course of fire, so see detailed descriptions and/or ask for more info. We really have some fun and unusual courses of fire, many you simply won't see anywhere else.
- Metallic Silhouette: Using .22 rimfire and/or straight-walled pistol cartridge rifles and pistols, you get to knock metal animals off rails at 40, 50, 75, and 100 yards. Bang. Ping! Fun. Do you have a .22 in the safe? Bring it out. On a personal note, I started shooting metallic silhouette with a fixed sight .22 conversion on a Glock 19, and had to hold about a foot and a half over the rams at 100 yards. I occasionally heard the 'ping', and was addicted.
- Fun Steel: Categories for almost any handgun, and rimfire and pistol cartridge rifles. Trying to hit an array of steel targets at various distances with the clock running. This is excellent training for running your gun and learning the balance of speed vs. accuracy, and way more fun than punching paper.
